Explanation: URDPFI stands for Urban and Regional Development Plans Formulation and Implementation, a comprehensive set of guidelines published by the Ministry of Urban Development, India.

Explanation: Architect and urban planner Peter Calthorpe is credited with popularizing Transit-Oriented Development (TOD), focusing on walkable, mixed-use communities centered around high-quality transit systems.
