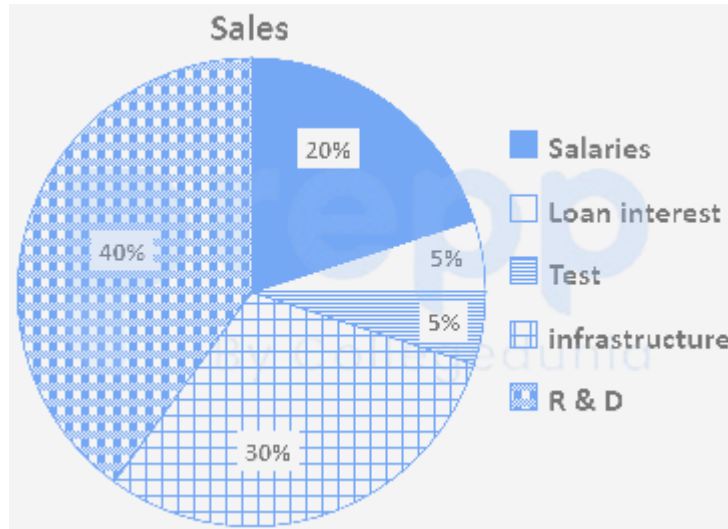

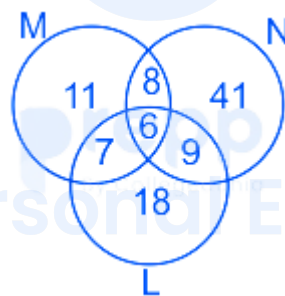

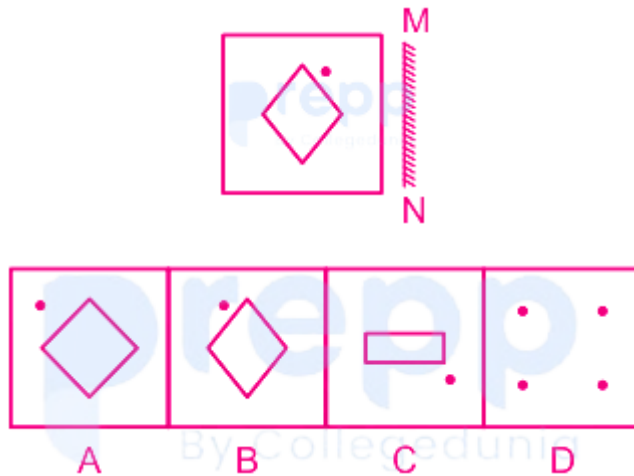

The Correct Answer is Option 2 i.e Lateral meristem.

- **Meristematic tissue:**
 - Growing regions of the plants are called **Meristem**.
 - It is again divided into three types: Apical, Lateral and Intercalary meristems.
 - Apical Meristems: These tissues are found in root and stem apex and it is responsible for the initial growth of the plants.
 - Lateral meristem: The girth of stem or root increases due to this tissue.
 - Intercalary meristem: Plants increase its length by the activity of this.
- **Parenchyma**: makes up most of the cells within leaves, flowers, and fruits.
