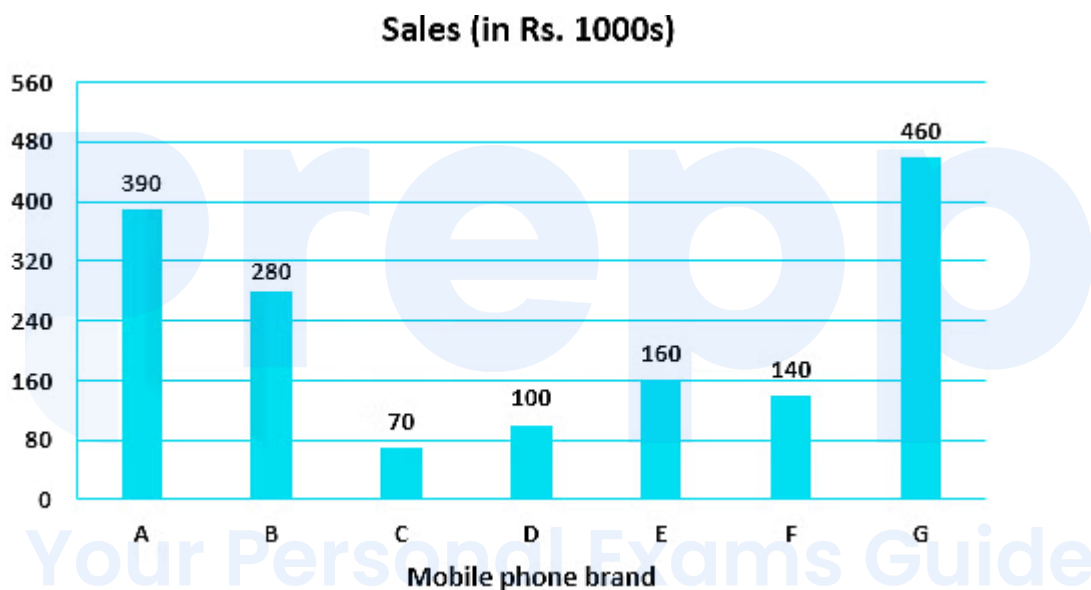

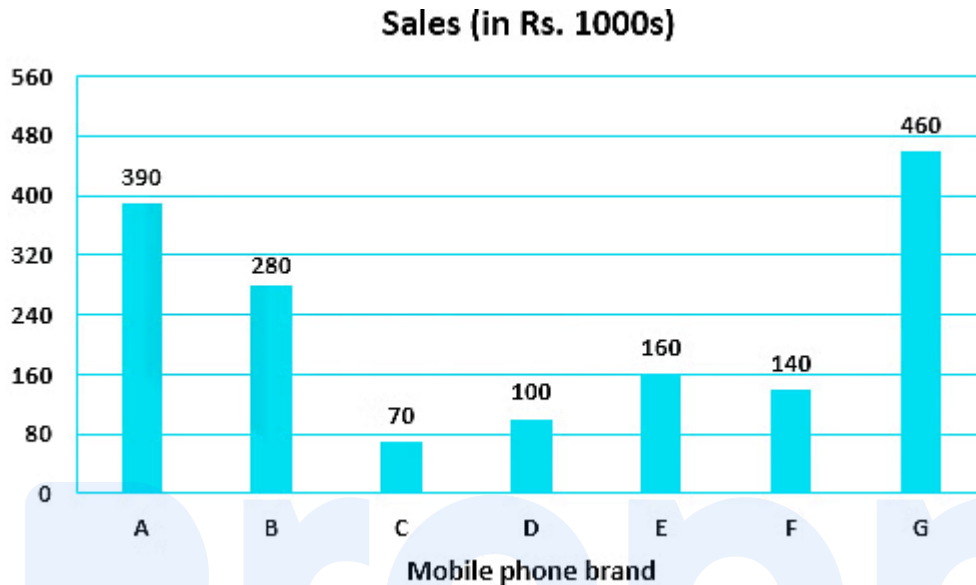

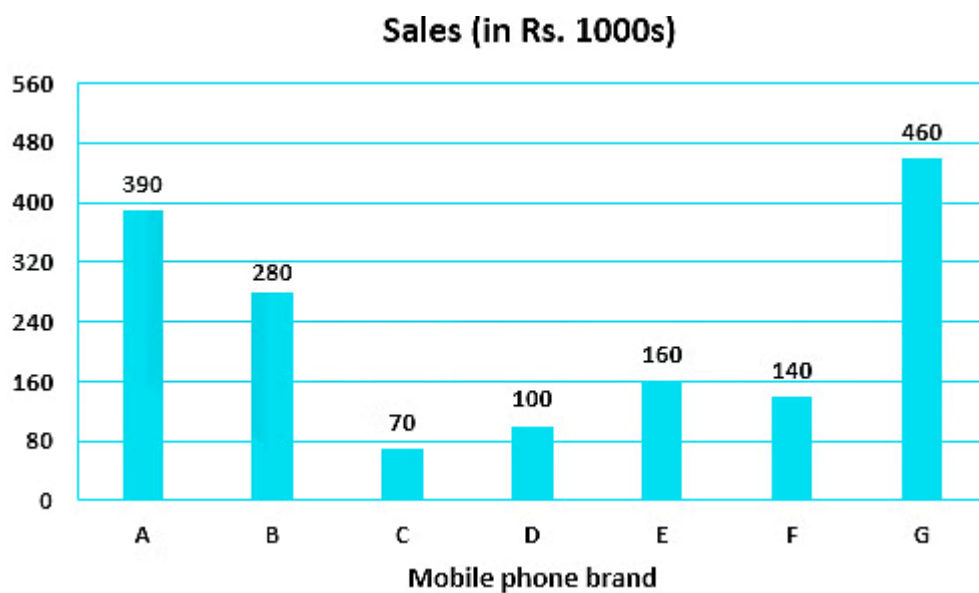

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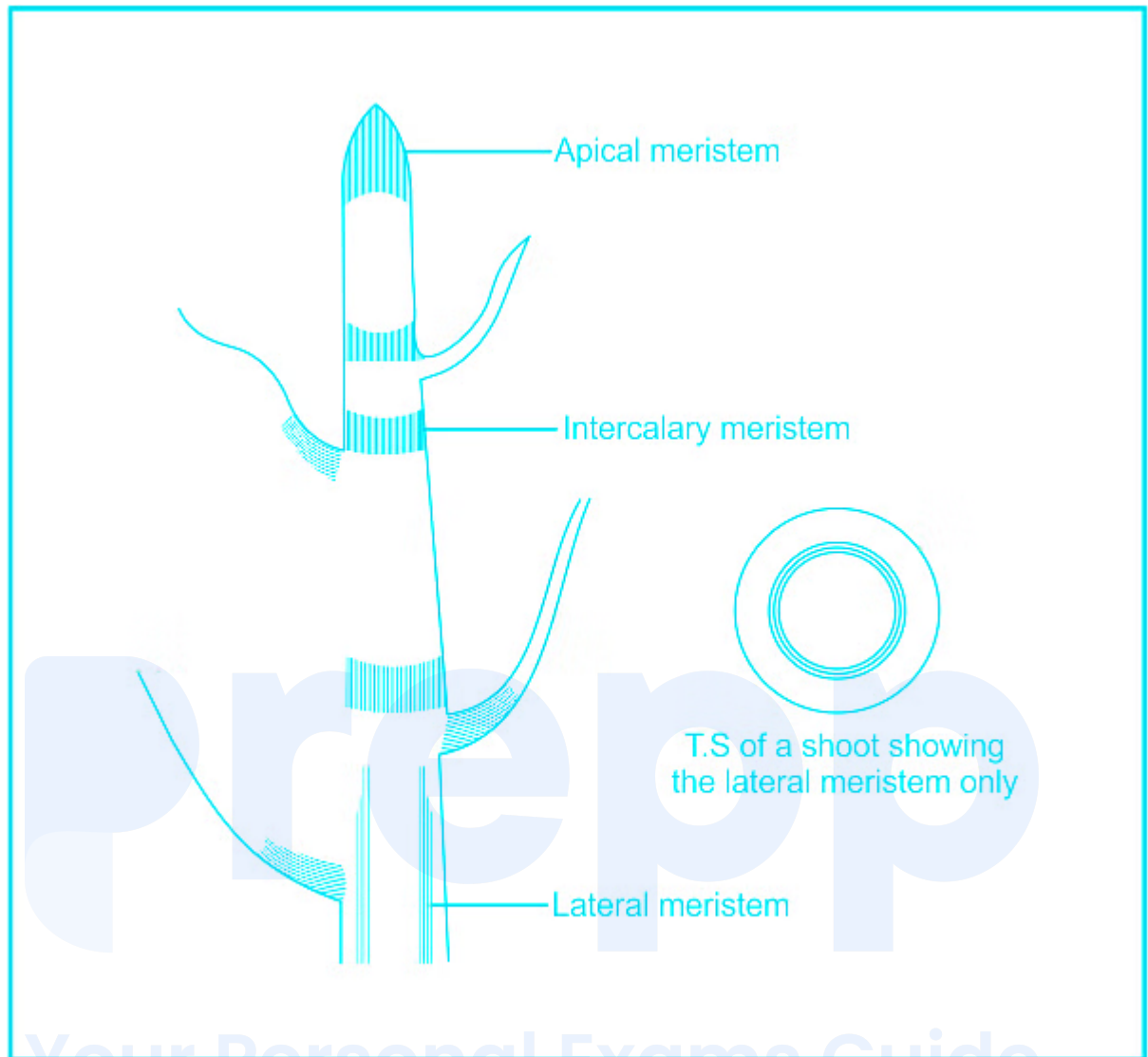


Diagram showing positions of meristems in L.S. and T.S
