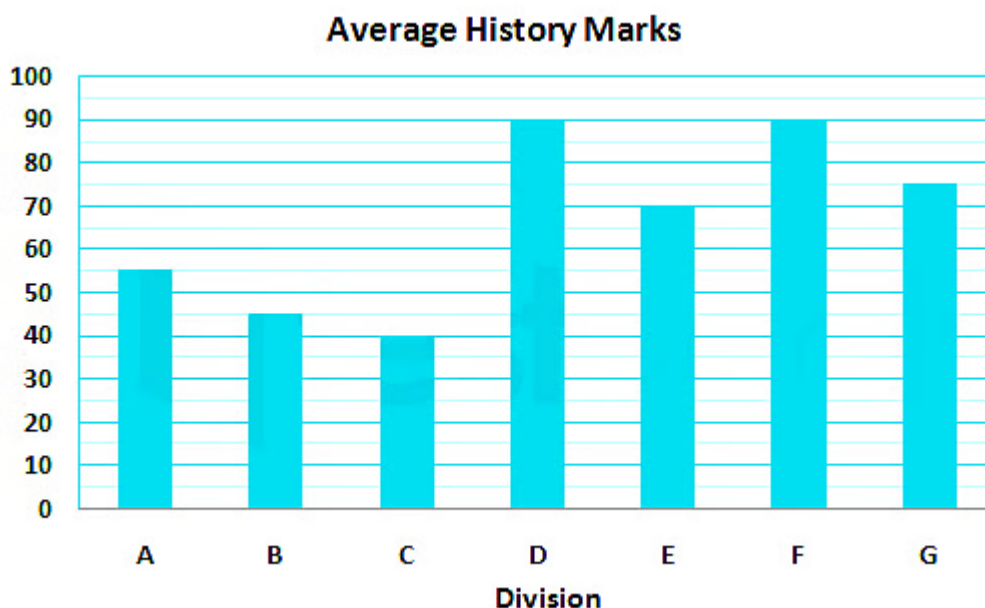

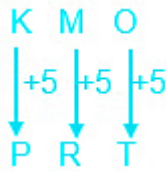

- The European planters at Champaran in Bihar practiced indigo cultivation through illegal methods and forced the Indian farmers to cultivate Indigo on $\frac{3}{20}$ th part of their land. This was called Tinkathia system.
- This natural Indigo was used to make dye. The Germans, by then, had invented the way to make artificial dye because of which the demand for natural Indigo fell.
- Now, if the farmers wished to shift to cultivate other crops, they could do so only by paying a large amount of 'compensation' or 'Tawan'.
- Thus, Champaran's peasants with the help of Gandhi Ji and Rajendra Prasad organized Champaran Satyagraha and abolished Tinkathia system (1919).

The famous Kosijura Case of Bengal happened in the reign of Warren Hastings.

- Kosijura Case of Bengal happened in 1779.
- A baboo named Kashinath was instigated to bring an action in the Supreme Court in August 1779, against his master, the Raja of Kosijurah, lying to the south of Calcutta.
- The Court despatched two sheriff's officers, with a body of eighty-six men, all armed with muskets or swords, who misbehaved and maltreated his servants, violated the sanctity of the zenana, and desecrated his family temple, packing up the idol with other lumber in a basket, and affixing the seal of the Court to it.
- Hastings considered that the time had at length arrived when he could no longer delay to vindicate the authority of the government and afford protection to the natives, whatever might be the hazard attending it.
- He instructed the military officer at Midnapore to intercept the whole party on their return, and march them to Calcutta, where they were immediately

liberated.

- To prevent similar outrages, he likewise issued a proclamation, directing all landholders of every degree to consider themselves exempt from the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court, except in the two cases of their having bound themselves by agreement to submit to it, or being British subjects.
- The Supreme Court then proceeded to issue summons against the Governor-General himself and the members of the Supreme Council, but they peremptorily refused to obey it.
