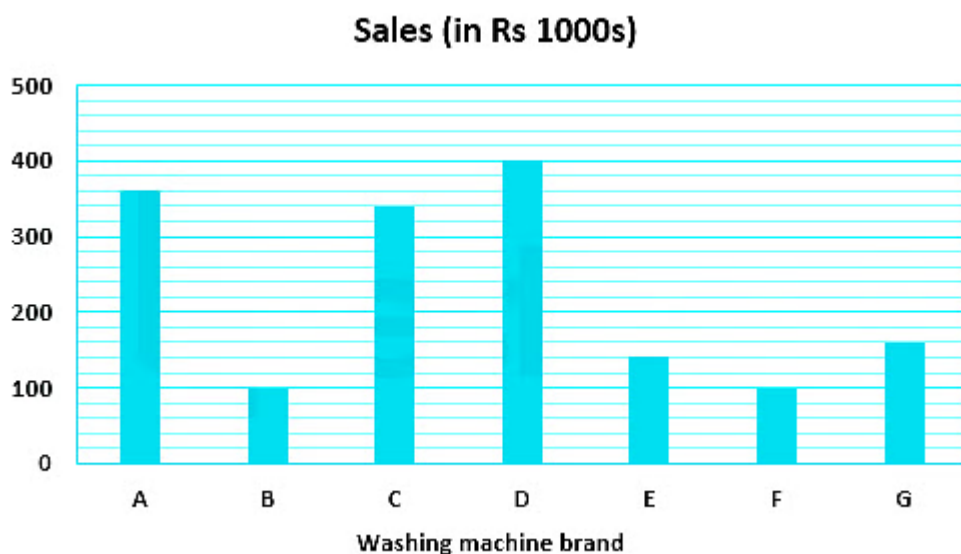

- The solar output received at the top of the atmosphere varies slightly in a year due to the variations in the distance between the earth and the sun.
- During its revolution around the sun, the earth is farthest from the sun on July 4. (Aphelion)
- During Aphelion earth will be 152 million km away from the sun.
- On January 3, the earth is nearest to the sun (147 million km) and this position is called Perihelion.
- The annual insolation received by the earth on January 3 is slightly more than the amount received on July 4.
- Since the effect of this variation is masked by other factors like the distribution of land and sea and atmospheric circulation, this variation in the solar output does not have a great effect on daily weather changes on the surface of the earth.
