- On Grant-in-aid for Indigenous Schools, the commission recommended grants-in-aid for the indigenous schools based on "Payments by Results".
- The aided schools would charge lower rates of fees than those charged by similar government aimed institutions and these schools should be allowed to employ more Indian graduates trained in European Universities.
- Emphasis on Moral and Physical Education was made.
- The commission emphasized that there has to be the exclusion of religious education.
- There should be literary and vocational training in secondary education.
- The commission brought out inadequate facilities available for female education in the country.
- Special attention should be paid to the development of education among Muslims .

Impact

- Most of its recommendations were accepted by the British Government which resulted in the devolution of elementary education.
- This significantly reduced the British element in elementary education. In 1882, the Punjab University was established
- As a result between 1882 to 1901, the number of students enrolled in primary and secondary schools increases substantially.

- If a child entering school leaves it or is withdrawn from school before completing class V, it leads to wastage in education.
- So wastage is the premature withdrawal of children from schools. A rough and ready method to measure wastage is to compare diminution in enrolment from class to class in a series of years.

Stagnation Meaning—"The retention of a child in the same class for a period of more than one year is called stagnation."

- Stagnation is a major factor responsible for wastage in primary education, both directly and indirectly.
- The students at every stage of education are expected to pass the examination after finishing the whole course.
- But it has been found that in general practice many students are not able to pass the examinations in one class or in more than one class within the prescribed period.

- Thus, they fail and remain in the same class. These failed students repeat the same class and course whereas their other colleagues pass that class and study in the next upper class. This process has been called the process of stagnation. Thus stagnation, it is meant the stay of students in a particular class for more than one year.
- The problem of 'wastage' and 'stagnation' is primarily related to education's primary level (1 to 5).

Really it was the Hartog Committee (1929), which for the first time pointed out that the "massive wastage and stagnation are taking place in primary education. Primary Education is ineffective unless it at least produces literacy".

Causes of Wastage and Stagnation:

The causes of wastage and stagnation are of 3 categories: **economic, educational, and social.**

★ Additional Information

- **Economic Causes:** At the age of 9 or 10, the child becomes an economic asset, because he can work at home or earn something outside. This is especially true of girls who have to assist the over-worked mother at home. The child is withdrawn from the school and thus he becomes a wastage case".
- **Social Causes:** Class and caste distinctions prevail in India, the former in urban areas and the latter in rural areas. Especially in the case of girls custom of early marriages or betrothals stands a bar. There is an opposition to sending grown-up girls to schools especially to the mixed schools without women teachers.
- **Educational Causes:** Only educational causes are responsible for another 30% of wastage. The government of India admits this in the following words: "The educational institutions being ill-equipped, poorly housed and with the dull and depressing environment, unfortunately, could not exercise effective counter-acting influence".

The increased number of single-teacher schools, inefficient teaching, lack of teacher-pupil contact, frequent transfer of teachers, and plural class-teaching disturbed the quality of instruction which ultimately cause much wastage and stagnation.

Stage V: Advanced Fluency

- Children reach near-native proficiency and produce highly accurate language. They also exhibit high levels of comprehension, but may not understand all academic language.
- Length of stage: It takes four to ten years to achieve cognitive academic language proficiency in a second language.
- What can you do? Continue using visuals to assist with content-specific language. Offer challenging activities, such as identifying synonyms and antonyms, in order to expand vocabulary knowledge.

Roleplay method

- The word 'role' implies accepting a part in a sequence and play means acting it out. Roleplay is more flexible compared to a drama. The drama will have a fixed theme, the conversations being prefixed, the sequence of events being rigidly followed, etc.
- The role play does not have any one of these. In a role-play, there may be the theme, but the conversations will have to be evolved by a group of students or actors. Sometimes role play is organized without having necessary rehearsals.

Lecture method

- The lecture is one of the most common teacher-centered teaching methods used by teachers of social sciences at the secondary level. It is an example of "expository" teaching, in which the input is directly provided by the teacher who communicates the new information or process.
- Apart from its major function of giving information, it plays certain unique functions which cannot be performed by other inanimate sources

Demonstration Method

- It helps in involving various sense to make learning permanent
- Though teacher behavior is autocratic, he invites the cooperation of pupils in the teaching-learning process

- It develops an interest in the learners and motivates them for their active participation. It helps in achieving psychomotor objectives.
- Any simple or complex skill becomes easy to understand.

John Watson is called the father of behaviourism. There are two types of conditioning: Operant and Classical.

★ Key Points

- Operant: This method of conditioning works on reinforcement and punishment. If one activity occurs more often than another, it can be used to reinforce the activity that occurs less often, this principle is known as Skinner's Principle. Reinforcement promotes the happening of behaviour in the future while punishment is a term that implies the reduction of happening of behaviour in the future. It has positive (to add) and negative (to take away) factors:
 - Positive Reinforcement: To add an action to repeat the outcome. For example: Offering rewards (action added) when children give correct answers. It should be noted that token money can also be used for this purpose in which tokens (fake currency, buttons, stickers) can be given and later exchanged with rewards.
 - Negative Reinforcement: To take away an action to repeat an outcome. For example, Restrictions are removed (action is taken away) from prisoners when they behave well.
 - Positive Punishment: To add an action to reduce an outcome. For example, Kids are sent outside the class (action added) so that they don't make noise. (action reduced).
 - Negative Punishment: To take away an action to prevent something from happening. For example, The government asks citizens to stay at home (the government is taking away the freedom to go out) to prevent a pandemic.

Hence, we can conclude that **Punishment is a negative type of reinforcement.**

- Ability to make right and timely decisions is crucial for success in life. One major goal of counselling is to make the individual capable of making independent decisions. Improving personal effectiveness

- An effective person is one who is able to control impulses, think in creative ways and has the competence to recognize, define and solve problems. It can be seen that these different goals are not exclusive. These are all interdependent and overlapping.

- For development, change is always necessary. Counselling helps individuals to make changes in their attitudes, perceptions or personality.

Behaviour modification

- Another aim of counselling is to help in modifying the behaviour. Removal of undesirable behaviour or self-defeating behaviour and learning desirable behaviour is considered necessary for attaining effectiveness and good adjustment. Behaviourally oriented counsellors are the chief proponents of this view.
