There is scarcely any region so barren as to be without vegetation of some sort, appropriate to its environment. There is, literally, no end to the interesting subjects of inquiry opened up, when we consider the diversified beauty and universal distribution of flowers. In the earlier times of natural history, life was regarded as the exclusive possession of animals; but with the advance of science, plants were included in the category of living beings. According to some, plants are unconscious, but we cannot agree with this.
